甲、申論題部分：(75 分)

一、英譯中：

(一) Prior to the invention of writing, our ancestors had to rely on memory, sketches, or music to encode and preserve important information. Memory is fallible, of course, but not because of storage limitations so much as retrieval limitations. Some neuroscientists believe that nearly every conscious experience is stored somewhere in your brain; the hard part is finding it and pulling it out again. Sometimes the information that comes out is incomplete, distorted, or misleading.

(二) For readers of books, reading letters on a page is only one of its many guises. The astronomer reading a map of stars that no longer exist; the Japanese architect reading the land on which a house is to be built so as to guard it from evil forces; the zoologist reading the spoor of animals in the forest; the Chinese fortune-teller reading the ancient marks on the shell of a tortoise; the psychiatrist helping patients read their own bewildering dreams; the Hawaiian fisherman reading the ocean currents by plunging a hand into the water—all these share with book-readers the craft of deciphering and translating signs. 【擬答】

(一) 在書寫發明之前，我們的祖先必須仰賴記憶、素描或音樂將重要資訊編碼和保存。當然，記憶是會有誤的，但與其說是因為貯存的限制倒不如說是檢索的限制。一些神經科學家認為幾乎每一則有意識的經歷都會被貯存在大腦的某處；困難的是找到它且再度將它取出。有時候顯示的資訊不完整的、被曲解的或是誤導的。

(二) 對於書籍的讀者來說，閱讀書頁上的字只是眾多形式的其中一種。天文學家查看著地圖上不再出現的星星；日本建築師覺察土地上一棟將被興建的房屋，目的是保護它免於惡勢力；動物學家看出森林裡動學的足跡；中國算命師解讀龜殼上古老的標記；精神科醫師協助病人解讀令人困惑的夢；夏威夷漁夫把手伸進水裡來解讀洋流—以上這些是和讀書的人分享破解和轉譯符號的手巧。

二、中譯英：

(一) 音樂能夠讓人快樂無須爭辯，使人感到快樂的神經化學物質也能夠增強免疫系統。可是，人和喜悅有關的神經生理機制非常複雜。人腦的確有獨立的「愉悅中樞」，但還有很多不同的神經傳導物質與其他腦區會促成愉悅感。在研究方面，雖然很多個案顯示音樂對病人有正面影響，有時效應甚至十分驚人，但真正進行實驗並加以記錄的文獻非常少。大量的軼事令人印象深刻，但無法構成科學研究證明。(15 分)

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(二)我最近強烈意識到提出「對的問題」的價值。我們往往只是制式化地溝通，只接觸到表面。對我來說更有意義的是深入發掘一個人行為背後的原因及動機。特別是在溝通時，真心地詢問對方有什麼感受、為什麼會做某些行為，你會得到相當不一樣的觀點。(15分)

【擬答】

- (一) There is no denying that music can be delightful and neurochemicals pleasing people can also strengthen immune system. However, humans' physical mechanism related to pleasure is terribly complicated. The human brain does have an independent "pleasure center", but there are different neurotransmitters and other brain lobes responsible for sense of pleasure. In the aspect of research, although quite a few cases indicate that music has a positive effect on patient -- sometimes amazing effects – but the documents recording the experiments and notes are sparse. A great number of anecdotes are impressive but fail to serve as scientific proofs.
- (二) I am keenly aware of the value of coming up with "right questions." We tend to communicate in the form of standardization, scratching the surface. For me, it is more significant to deeply probe into the reason and motive behind a person's behavior. Particularly in communication, wholeheartedly asking others how they feel and why they did certain kinds of behaviors, you will acquire fairly different viewpoints.
